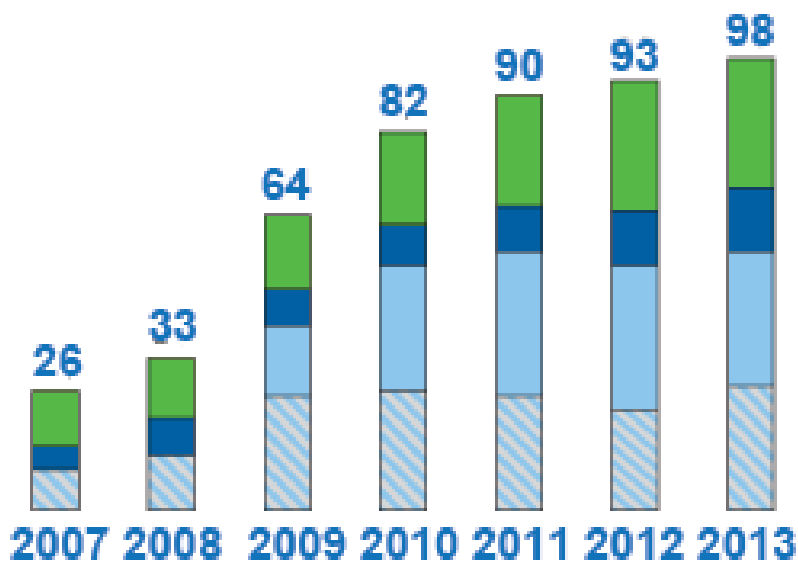
At the epicenter of this movement sits the World Green Building Council and our nearly 100 GBC members whose organisations are responsible for this remarkable market uptake.

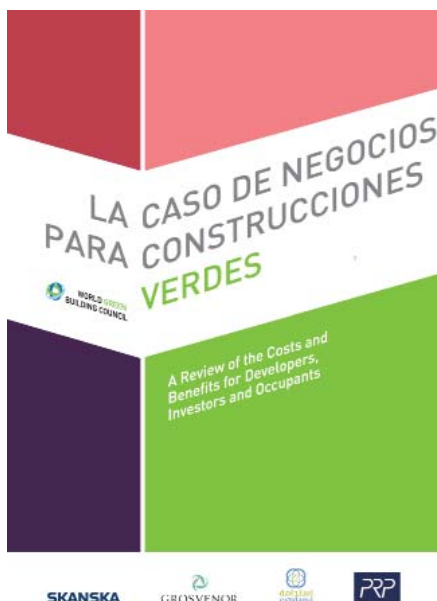
The Business Case for Green Building

Socio Economic Framework for Rating Tools

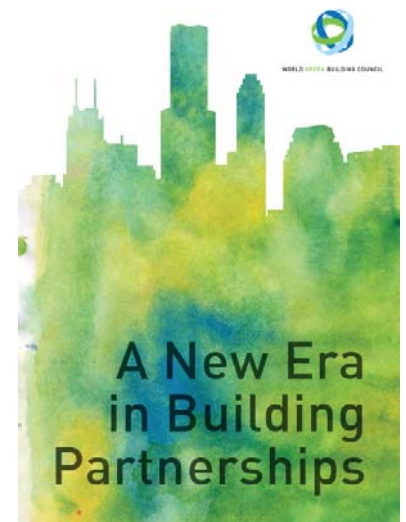
For GBCs operating in developing countries with large-scale social and economic challenges, focusing on environmental outcomes is not enough. To help address these issues, the WorldGBC and the GBC South Africa established a joint project to develop a framework to enable socio-economic issues to be integrated into any green building rating system in the world.

All GBCs were invited to download the draft framework and provide comments in 2013. Now, we're almost ready to launch!
